WEEKEND RECAP- SCHOLASTIC ESPORTS AWARDS

This past weekend, Mia White represented the NJCAA at the first-ever Scholastic Esports Awards, hosted by Esports Foundry and VOICE. The ceremony recognized individuals and groups within the community in 20 categories, including some of our very own member schools. In fact, there were 132 finalists from both K-12 and collegiate sectors.

The Scholastic Esports Awards team put it best: "Scholastic Esports is so much bigger than what it has been, and our communities have evolved in so many ways over the years. Hundreds of thousands of students play, compete, and take part in local, regional, and national communities, conversations, and competitions... This event is by us and for us."
